5. International Body: Federation Internationale D'Escrime (FIE). On November 29th, 1913 at a meeting in Paris, the national fencing representatives of France, Italy, Great Britain, Germany, Belgium, Bohemia, Holland, Hungary and Norway met and decided to form the Federation International d'Escrime, which has been the governing body of the sport ever since. Later in 1918, the first F.I.E. rule book was published. At present, there are over 80 countries affiliated with the Federation. The F.I.E. is striving to make fencing more visual and dynamic through the use of transparent masks, wireless scoring devices and electronic scoring boards. 5. Brief Introduction of the Fencing Sport:

Origin and Development

Fencing began as a form of combat and is known to have been practiced well before the birth of Christ. Relief carvings in the temple of Madinet-Habu near Luxor, Egypt, dating from approximately 1190 BC depict fencers competing. Many other ancient civilizations, including China, Japan, Persia, Babylonia and Greece, practiced swordplay as training for combat.

As a sport, fencing began in either the 14th or 15th century and both Italy and Germany lay claim to the origins of the sport. Three innovations in the 17th century led to the popularity of fencing as a sport. The first was the development of a light practice weapon with a flattened or "foiled" tip that was also padded to reduce the risk of injury. This weapon was soon called the foil. Second was the development of a set of rules that limited the target to certain areas of the body. The final innovation was the quadrille wire-mesh mask which protected the face and made fencing a safe activity.

The sport has been part of all Olympics since 1896 onwards. The first modern Olympic Games featured foil and sabre fencing for men only. Epee was introduced in 1900. Single stick was featured in the 1904 games. Epee was electrified in the 1936 games, foil in 1956, and sabre in 1988. Early Olympic Games featured events for Masters, and until recently fencing was the only Olympic sport that has included professionals'. Women's foil was first contested in the 1924 Olympic Games, and Women's epee was only contested for the first time in 1996, although it has been part of the World Championships since 1989. Women's sabre made its first appearance in the 1998 World Championships as a demonstration sport.

Fencing is probably one of the oldest sports in existence, for it sprang directly from the duel, and the later has been extant as long as there has been war. It can be defined as a sport practiced in pairs and employing a weapon (Foil, Sabre or Epee). The objective is to hit the opponent with a thrust in foil and epee or with a cut or thrust in Sabre, in a manner and on a target area specified by the rules of fencing. Fencing can be described as the skilled use of the sword for offence or defense. This sport is also known as **"the chess with muscles"**. Fencing of today employ a strange combination of archaic and modern customs, combatants still salute before a match and wear the traditional white uniform and mask, but scoring is now determined by electronic padding worn by the combatants.

In the last decade fencing has undergone numerous revisions to its rules and structure to improve its value as a spectator sport.

6. Whether Olympic Games (OG) sports or not? If yes, since when introduced?

Yes, it has been part of all Olympic Games since 1896 Athens, Modern Olympic Games. However, the first modern Olympic Games featured foil and sabre fencing for men only. Epee Category and Women events were included subsequently. The father of Modern Olympic Games, **Baron De Coubertien** was himself a fencer.

7. Whether Asian Games (AG) sports or not? If yes, since when introduced?

Yes, fencing was introduced in Tehran (Iran) Asian games in 1974. Since then it is regular feature in Asian Games.

8. Other level of Championships where sports is played.

The sport is being played at continental level competitions. Following Championships are organized regularly as per program circulated by **"FIE"**- World Championship / Asian / commonwealth / world Cup / Grand Prix / Satellite/ SAF/ World Military Games /World University Games etc. The sport has approximately 150 official and unofficial competitions in a calendar year.

ACTC of fencing has been prepared in view of upcoming Asian Games, Commonwealth Championship and subsequently keeping in mind the qualification criteria of Olympics for the Tokyo Olympics 2020. ACTC of fencing has been framed and ruthlessly based on Long Term Athlete Development. It is a framework encompassing every element of international aspirations of fencing, which holds the fencer as an athlete as the focus of the sport. The ACTC has following aims:-

- (a) To establish a clear development start for long term success.
- (b) To allow us to realign the competition program to best serve the needs of the Asian Games and Olympics aspirations.
- (c) To provide a planning tool for coaches and fencers
- (d) To help every fencer see where they are on the development Pathway.
- (e) To improve our success at major international championships.
- (f) To get coordinating agencies on platform for goal accomplishment.

ACTC has been framed in such a manner where in competitions and training both in India as well as abroad has been planned keeping micro and macro training cycles in mind. The same will help us to help fencers perform at their peak level. FAI has included all the requirements of Support staff and equipment requirements of fencers. The endeavor of FAI is to win medals at Asian Games/Commonwealth Championship and lay a foundation for an Olympic berth in 2020.

19. Foreign Coaches (Provide number and approximate cost)

Role of Foreign Coaches .Foreign Coaches are inescapable requirement to perform at top level competitions since most of the Indian fencing coaches and coaching programmes are in developing stage and short of international standards. Selecting a suitable coach may not be an easy process ,consider the various possibilities to determine the best foreign coach for Indian Fencers .At this point,it does not necessarily mean an Olympic level coach, but rather a coach who will work well with our fencers. A coach should instill good training habits, model fair play and prepare our fencers for big competitions. The coach should feel comfortable correlating with the Indian Sports system concerns and goals. Coaches of East European nations deemed fit for fencing. The coaches from Ukraine, Poland, Russia and Romania are fit to be hired for Indian sportsmen as they understand the Indian fencers and National sports. It is pertinent to mention that Fencing requires three coaches where in currently FAI has limited services of 02x foreign coaches available with Army Sports Institue, Pune.Recommended remunerations are as follows :-

- (i) Grade I/A Coaches : USD 10000
- (ii) Grade II/B Coaches : USD 6000
- (iii) Grade III/C Coaches : USD 3000.

20. Expectation of FAI from Foreign Coaches

The following is expected from foreign coach of fencing when employed on yearly contract.

- (a) To have an in-depth knowledge of each sport.

- (b) To understand the macro cycle concept and formulate the training program accordingly.
- (c) To have detail knowledge of fencing model of advanced nations.
- (d) To implement the recommendations of the, doctors ,nutritionist and psychologists made during discussion of the macro cycle.
- (e) To monitor, compile and analyse results of all physical, psychological, and biological tests conducted.
- (f) To design the micro cycle as per the plan .
- (g) To set the goals required to be achieved in the next competition.
- (h) Make impartial recommendations regarding athletes based on performance and assessed potential.
- (j) Foreign coaches must make all efforts theoretically and practically to elevate the standard of Indian coaches.

(a) To win medals in World / Asian / Commonwealth Championships / Games (Senior/Junior/Cadet).

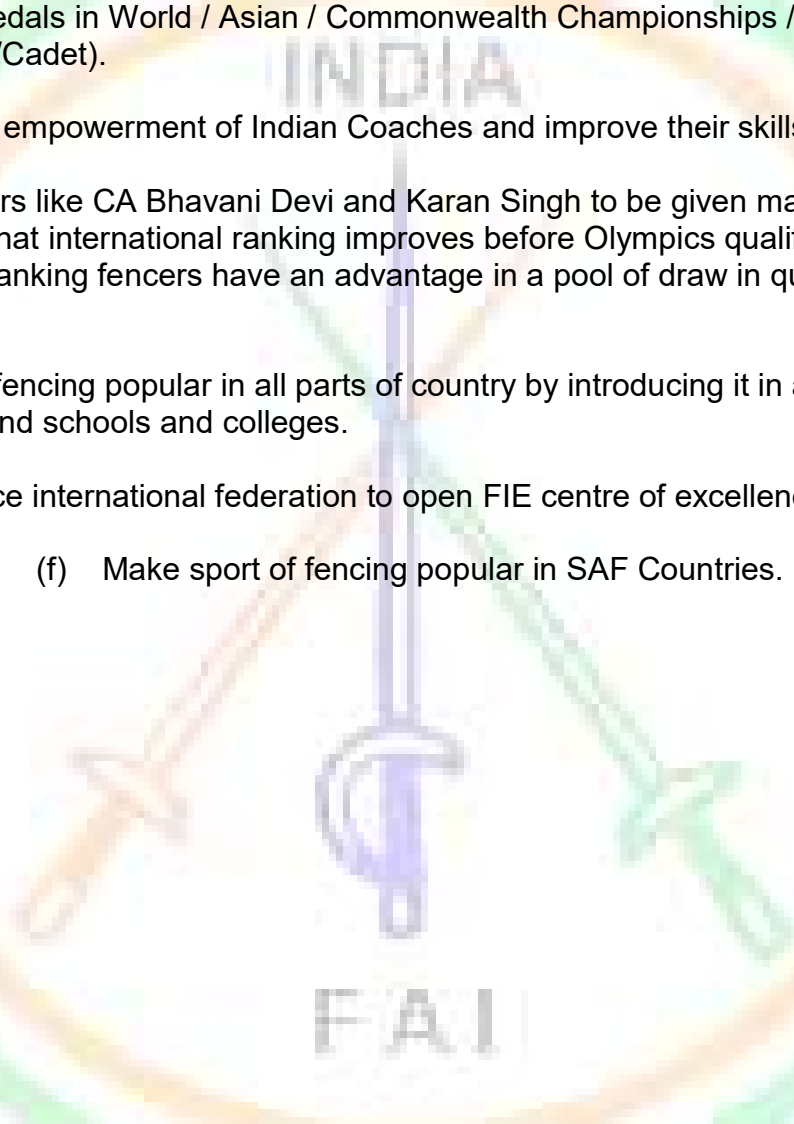
(b) To ensure empowerment of Indian Coaches and improve their skills.
